On 19-21 November 2024, the eleventh edition of the human rights forum "HUMAN FORUM - Democracy in Danger!" will take place in Banská Bystrica, initiated by the informal civic platform NIE V NAŠOM MESTE in Banská Bystrica.

HUMAN FORUM is an established international discussion forum on democracy and human rights. Since 2014, it has been working in Banská Bystrica with themes resonating with the public, academic and civic sectors. It is a space for building partnerships for local, regional and international democratic communities, a place for education, a platform for open debates, promotion of democracy, tolerance and respect for human rights.

HUMAN FORUM creates opportunities for the civil sector and academia to meet with senior public, private and government officials from the domestic and international arena. It brings together three diverse days of debates, roundtables and workshops under the overarching thematic key - Democracy at Risk.

The first day of the Forum is filled with the theme of the political and practical importance of building democracy from below. The second day adds a link to science, research and academia to the agenda. The third layer of the forum is a look at education as it connects to the work of the non-governmental sector and is packed with practical input for teachers of all grade levels. The programme is complemented each day with debates open to the wider public and a variety of artistic inputs.

The theme of democratic local communities is ever relevant and essential to the maintenance of a democratic polity in any free country. Without democracy from below, it is impossible to build a strong, sustainable and resilient democratic society as a whole. The eleventh edition of the event is thematically linked to the civil society meetings called "small HUMAN FORUM", organized in different regions of Slovakia in 2023 and 2024

Civil society based on the principles of creating tolerant local communities can mitigate the impact of political struggles. These are evident not only in Slovakia, but also in other countries in Europe and the world that claim to have advanced levels of democracy and political culture. Reflecting on these global social trends, we have decided to bring together people and organisations that play a significant role in building healthy democratic local communities through the HUMAN FORUM event.

The eleventh edition of the HUMAN FORUM event will take place in an atmosphere where the current political and state leaders are trying to question the importance of a free civil society, unprecedentedly attacking NGOs, discrediting them in the eyes of the public, without the standard procedure that belongs to the authorities of justice in the case of suspicions. It is in our interest that this edition provides a space for interactive discussions with various partners from international organisations and institutions, with representatives of public and state administration, civil society, academia and the private business sector on how to harness the potential of such a broad partnership.

The civic platform NIE V NAŠOM MESTE, which is the main organiser of the HUMAN FORUM event, has declared the need for mutual tolerance and understanding between races, nations and different faiths since its inception. That is why, in cooperation with the Catholic, Evangelical and other churches in Banská Bystrica, we are preparing an ecumenical service for the seventh time.

The aim of the forum is

- to deepen awareness of the fundamental values in a democratic society,
- to call for respect and reverence for human rights,
- to highlight shortcomings and negative social phenomena such as intolerance and extremism,
- seek tools to address them, including both prevention and deradicalisation,
- contribute to the spread of tolerance in society.

Abstract: What does science tell us about uneven regional development and the rise of democratic discontent? Across Europe, the rise of populism reflects the "revenge of places that don't matter" - communities that have no access to economic development and have been abandoned by social and political systems. This panel discussion will explore the 'geography of discontent', focusing on regions experiencing long-term decline, social exclusion and rising populism. Slovakia, one of the most centralized countries in Europe, faces deep regional disparities, making it a key case for understanding how economic marginalization fosters political instability. Join us in uncovering the links between economic inequality, regional stagnation, and growing support for populist movements across Europe and beyond, and considering the global implications of these trends for democracy and governance.

Panel discussion

Abstract: This panel discusses findings from the election advisory app Voter Compass and related research on the recent national parliamentary elections in Slovakia, highlighting the increasing fragmentation of voter loyalty and deepening affective polarization. Slovak voters are currently aligning themselves with some party positions while disagreeing with other positions of the same party, thus the political scene is experiencing significant shifts. By placing the Slovak experience in a broader European context, the discussion will offer a comparative perspective on how similar patterns of fragmentation and polarisation affect voter behaviour, party systems and democratic stability in Europe and beyond.

Abstract: Civil society, human rights defenders and advocates in Slovakia are currently facing hate speech and efforts to discredit or limit their participation in governance by government and political leaders.
